Throughout the term, we have been learning about all kinds of celebrations, from Bonfire night and Remembrance day, to Divali and Christmas. We even had our own wedding ceremony! The children have also been working incredibly hard during their phonics and maths lessons, and the adults working with our youngest learners have been blown away by their enthusiasm towards their own learning. We have a group of children who already understand the importance of saying, 'I can try' when attempting something new, which we value as a very important learning behaviour.

On top of all of this, the children have truly risen to the challenge of putting on their first Christmas show. Members of staff hearing our rehearsals commented on the children's' beautiful singing voices and we have all loved watching their confident performances. All the staff in Phase 3 are so proud of how hard the children have worked this term and how much progress they have made. Any visitors that we have had in school or other professionals, such as swimming coaches and Pacesetters coaches, have commented on just how eager, well behaved, and polite the children have been.

We have been wowed by the quality of writing the children produced in their hot-writes. Newspaper reports are a tricky genre but every child showed they could use at least one of the tools from their writing toolkits (we had to order more green highlighters!) The children really enjoyed the driver text, 'Heidi', which linked beautifully with their learning about the Alpine region. Mountain formation, house design, tourism and avalanches are just a few of the areas that the children are now experts in.

Learning their times tables has been a focus in Phase 3 this term and it has been lovely to see the pride that the children show when awarded their certificates, with 8 children already being awarded the badge to show that they have learnt all of their times tables. We would like to say a big thank you to all the parents and carers who have supported their children in this process at home. Being fluent in their times tables will have a huge impact in the children's ability to access other areas in mathematics.

We are finishing the term with our usual WOW week and the children have already demonstrated their improved paper working skills. We can't wait to see the finished Alpine houses.

Phase 4 – Year 5 and 6

The Phase 4 children have had another jampacked term, which started with Simon, our rainforest explorer. Simon has spent a lot of his life exploring different parts of our planet and was able to give the children SO much information about the Amazon Rainforest and his time there. The children (and staff) were glued to Simon's every word and the children asked so many brilliant questions about life, and especially the animals in the Amazon to build on their knowledge. This start to our topic unit about the Amazon Rainforest and River has led to even greater knowledge and intertest in our Topic lessons throughout this term.

In our English lessons, the children have worked diligently on their persuasive writing (just in time for Christmas) in order to persuade in all kinds of different ways. As well as this, they have produced mini-writes based on The Christmas Truce and The Hobbit.

The children have been learning all about the human body in science and learning some detailed biology. Within RE, they have been learning about Sikhism and the beliefs of the Sikh community and in PSHE they have been learning about happiness in our 'Keep Me Happy' unit.

Our phase has also been lucky enough to have Summer, from Northants County Cricket Club, to come and coach some of our PE sessions, which was a great opportunity.

As well as this great work in lessons, yet again it has been brilliant to see so many of our Phase 4 children taking extra responsibilities around school, from becoming lunchtime buddies for our youngest children, to being Learning Point Captains with numerous responsibilities, becoming Young Librarians, working as part of Pupils' Parliament, helping with the FS and KS1 Christmas Play, helping at the Christmas Fayre, being Young Leaders at extracurricular clubs and many more additional responsibilities that help to make our school community a better place. What an excellent set of children we have in our phase, they make us proud every day at school!
