



Maths

- count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in 10s from any number, forward and backward
- recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (10s, 1s)
- identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line
- compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use $<$, $>$ and $=$ signs
- read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words
- use place value and number facts to solve problems.

History

In History, the children will be learning all about the Gunpowder Plot and The Great Fire of London.

English

In our poetry unit this term, we will be learning and exploring different songs and rhymes about the sea. We will be writing our own list and rhyming poems.

Linking to our history topic, The Great Fire of London, we will be writing our own narrative of the event as well as exploring the key features of a non-chronological report. We will be practicing using capital letters for proper nouns (people and places), full stops, capital letters and question marks. As well as using coordinating conjunctions to join ideas in a sentence.

Science

In science, we will be learning how to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

RE and PSHE

In RE, we will be learning about what makes a Christian person special.

In PSHE, we will be learning about protective behaviours (behaviours to keep us safe).

Computing and PE

In computing, we are going to be learning how to code.

In PE, we will be learning footwork skills such as: side stepping, galloping, hopping, skipping, hop scotching and pivoting.

In DT in WOW week, we will be learning about construction materials. We will be using different materials to build The Great Fire of London houses.
