



Mathematics

This term in maths, we will be continuing to develop our knowledge of data handling, using the terms 'mode', 'mean' and 'median', as well as using pie charts. Children will be able to consolidate their knowledge of maths arithmetic terms and will apply their developing fluency to answer a range of problem solving questions, using a carefully considered rationale to justify their reasoning.

English

This term, our children will be writing in different genres. They will explore examples of rich texts to use as models, so that they learn to write in a similar author style that they have read. We will be considering audience and purpose carefully, and encouraging our children to use a full range of grammar and punctuation features in their writing, to have a specific effect on their reader.

Topic

Across the school this term and of course in Year 6, our topic will focus on the historical event of the Queen's Jubilee. We will be finding out about the rich history of monarchs of the past, who they were and what significant events / achievements they were linked to, that has contributed to our vast royal history. Children will also investigate what society was like during these different eras.

Computing and PE

Athletics will be the focus of PE this term, and children will participate in a range of summer athletic events.

This term, children will continue to develop their knowledge of programming, and how to arrange data in a computer program. They will also continue the important focus of online safety, leading towards their transition to secondary school.

Science

Children will develop their knowledge of the fascinating human body this term, through our focus on the human respiratory and circulatory system. We will be exploring the importance of key organs in the human body and why these are essential to our day to day health.

Wow week

Our music focus will be investigating the element of musical performance this term. Children will increase their knowledge of the roles of a choreographer, musical director and composer within musical performances, as well as analysing and evaluating musical performance pieces.

Curriculum enrichment

Careers Day will provide our children with an opportunity to gain an insight into the world of work. An array of expert visitors will kindly be sharing their work experiences and knowledge with our children. Workshops include information regarding training and various career paths, to inspire our young people. Our Brainboost project will focus on the legacy that our children will choose to leave for others at Mawsley.

RE and PSHE

RE this term will focus on the faiths of Islam and Christianity and the language of shared human experience.

PSHE will help to prepare children for the changes that will be occurring to their bodies through puberty, as well as the transition to secondary school. Children will also learn what to be aware of regarding the dangers of County Lines and how to avoid this.
