Measurement

Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction (m/cm); mass (kg/g); temperature (°C); capacity (litres/ml) to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels.

Properties of Shape

Compare and sort common 2D and 3D shapes and everyday objects.

Fractions

Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

History

In history, the children will explore similarities and differences between their own lives and those of people their grandparents' age. We will focus on homes, toys, shops and schools in the 1950s and 1960s.

Curriculum enrichment

World Book Day 3rd March 2022

English

In English, the children will be learning about information texts. They will be looking at features such as: pictures and captions, bullet points, a main title and subheadings.

Science

In science, the children will explore their local environment (school grounds or local park) to find out about the plants and animals that live in their locality. The Children will learn to name and identify common wild and garden plants, including trees, so they are familiar with common names.

RE and PSHE

In RE, we will be learning about Jewish festivals such as: Hanukkah and Yom Kippur.

In PSHE, we will be learning about how to make and maintain respectful relationships.

Computing and PE

In computing, children will retrieve digital content from the Internet for a particular purpose and use mind mapping software to organise their questions and answers about a topic. They will use presentation software to present their findings to an audience.

In PE, we will be learning ball skills, such as how to roll a ball with our fingertips, how to roll a ball around our bodies and how to pass a ball between our legs.

Wow week

In art in WOW week, we will be working on our painting. We will be looking at the colour wheel and learning how to make secondary colours as well as different tints through adding white and black.

In music, the children will use their bodies and instruments to listen and respond to pieces of classical music that represent animals. They will learn and perform a song as a class and compose a short section of music as a group, with a focus on dynamics and tempo.
