



English:

During this term the children will be learning to;

- Developing the ability to recognise and write their full name.
- Introduced to the phonics scheme (Read Write Inc).
- Introduced to Read Write Inc reading books and matched phonemes.
- Developing an interest in books and stories especially The Little Red Hen.
- Encouraged to write some simple Autumn labels.

Mathematics:

During this term the children will be leaning to;

- Recognise numbers to 5/ 10, write them and count out that many objects.
- Count objects that cannot be moved.
- Compare the size of groups of objects.
- Partition numbers to 5.
- Count things that cannot be touched.

Understanding the World:

During this term the children will be learning to;

- Talk about how families are different to each other.
- Recognise the changes in season from Summer to Autumn.
- Discover where their food comes from and how the journey it takes from field to plate.
- Think about the season of Autumn and what it actually looks like- brown leaves etc...

Communication and Language:

During this term the children will;

- Listen to a variety of stories and rhymes..
- Develop their oral skills by taking part in discussions.
- Use language to recreate roles and experiences in the role play areas.
- Use words to communicate their thoughts and feelings.

Expressive Arts and Design:

During this term the children will be involved in a variety of creative activities listed below;

- Drawing own families and houses.
- Self portraits using a range of media.
- Music- singing a range of songs.
- Drawing around their own shadows.



Physical Development:

During this term the children will;

- Play a variety of group games.
- Gain control over fastenings when putting own jumpers/ cardigans and coats on.
- Begin making attempts to use correct pencil grip and gain increasing control with mark making implements.
- Show an awareness of space.
- Begin to skip and learn to balance on one leg.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

During this term the children will be learning to;

- Be kind to each other.
- Show acceptable behaviour and follow the class rules.
- Adhere to the expectations of adults.
- Settle into school life and develop a sense of belonging within the school community.
- Dress and undress independently.



English:

How can you help at home?

- Share a range of books including non-fiction texts, encouraging children to look at the pictures.
- Continue practising name writing using name formation which was located in summer toolkits.

Mathematics:

How can you help at home?

- Look out for numbers on the way to and from school.
- Count out sets of objects around the house.

Understanding the World:

How can you help at home?

- Look for signs of Autumn in the local area and talk about what is the same and different about Spring/Summer/Spring/Winter
- Talk about food at meal times and where it has come from.

Communication and Language:

How can you help at home?

- Use initial sound stickers to practise pure sounds at home.
- Log onto Reading Eggs and start practising your phonics using Fast Phonics. Logins will be sent home in your child's reading record.

Expressive Arts and Design:

How can you help at home?

- Encourage children to work with a range of art media to continue their learning from school.
- Listen to a piece of music from a different culture and talk about it together.



Physical Development:

How can you help at home?

- Practise cutting skills using scissors.
- Practise colouring within the lines.
- Teach your child to how to put on clothes, socks and shoes and fasten a zip.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

How can you help at home?

- Chat with your child to discuss how their school day has been.
- Encourage your child to be independent e.g. putting on clothes, carrying and finding their own bag/bottle. A personalised tag might help.
