This term: leadership

At Mawsley Community Primary School this term, as well as our Keep Me Healthy Challenge, we are showcasing the leadership opportunities for children. These are a vital part of their personal development and help to build confidence, responsibility and teamwork. By taking on roles such as School Parliament, Learning Point Captains, or Anti-bullying Ambassadors, pupils learn to communicate effectively, make decisions and represent the views of their peers. These roles not only encourage a sense of pride and belonging but also help children develop essential life skills that prepare them for future challenges. At Mawsley, we believe that empowering pupils to lead and contribute to school life fosters independence and strengthens our inclusive, community-focused ethos.

Young Leaders Our young leaders take on responsibility to help organise, support and lead others in physical activities, games, or sports events.

Play Leaders Our young leaders help organise, support and lead others in games and activities during play and lunchtime. An important role in helping younger children to play, share and take turns.

Learning Point Captains These children help with the administration of our learning point teams and school groups. They work in collaboration with Mr Walton and Miss Harris to maintain and collate all of the school's learning points.

School Parliament These are the decision makers of the school. They have been elected by their classmates to represent their views and help make the school a better place.

Hub helpers A Hub Helper is a supportive peer who assists our SEND children throughout the school day by offering kindness, guidance, and practical help—especially during playtimes, PE lessons and other unstructured times—helping them feel included, confident and able to take part in all activities.

Anti-bullying ambassadors An anti-bullying ambassador is a pupil who takes on a special role in their school to help prevent bullying and create a kind, respectful, and inclusive environment. Ambassadors might help plan assemblies, run activities or campaigns and set a good example by treating everyone fairly and with kindness.

Eco Team A member of the school eco team is a student who helps make the school more environmentally friendly by promoting recycling, saving energy, and looking after nature. You may have seen them out and about in our community!
